
## LOCKPICKING

A door lock, just like a safe, provides a false sense of security for a merchant or businessman who is not security-oriented. This is because there is not a lock made that cannot be picked, given enough time and the proper tools. Door locks, in this age of electronics, offer primitive protection.

The photograph illustrates how a burglar with just an elementary knowledge of lock construction and the proper 'picking' tools can make short shift of the obstacle. The tools are inserted, and raking motions release the pin tumblers. No noise, and the door is opened quickly.

Frequently, a blank key coated with wax is used to open a locked door. The key is inserted, the tumblers are contacted, and the marks on the wax enable the burglar to file the correct keying notches.

Amateurs need not resort to sophisticated techniques to gain entry. A steel or iron bar can be used to jimmy a door. Bolts can be slid back by forcing a thin piece of metal or celluloid between the bolt and the striker plate, or the bolt can be sawed in



two with a hacksaw inserted between the door and the frame.

# Advantages Of Outcontracting Security

Security is a highly specialized business, which is why so many firms have been turning it over to outside companies like Doyle Detective Bureau. Cost factors are perhaps most important. Payroll preparation and fringe expenses are eliminated. Collective bargaining is dispensed with, as is the necessity for maintaining extra personnel to compensate for absenteeism, vacations, and peak security contingencies.

An outside agency, such as Doyle Detective Bureau, has the capacity to assign extra guards, on very short notice, whenever the necessity arises. The Bureau is constantly recruiting and training personnel. Guards that have been cleared for classified work and screened for personality, honesty, and performance are always available.

## From The Files: *Meat Theft Uncovered*

A meat packing company asked for an undercover operator to try to unearth suspected inventory shrinkages in its warehouse.

Following the usual procedure, the operator applied for a position with the company, through its personnel office, secured a job as a trucker's helper at the regular rate of pay.

Less than a month later, a complete file of illegal activities carried on by a ring inside the warehouse and on the trucks, was turned over to management.

The undercover operator found that two warehousemen, three drivers, six customers, and one gasoline station were involved in a scheme which was resulting in a heavy drain of money and merchandise. Extra sides of beef were being loaded onto the trucks without invoicing, and were being black-marketed to customers at reduced rates. In addition, the drivers were signing for full tanks of gas and just receiving half tanks plus the difference in cash from the gas station attendants.

It had been going on for a long time. It might have continued indefinitely, but for the work of the undercover operator who, at great personal danger, succeeded in gaining the confidence of the ring and was thus able to gather the necessary evidence.

Panic locks are extremely vulnerable. The very things which make it easy to open from the inside during an emergency also make it easy for a burglar to open from the outside.

Glass panel doors, seen so frequently in modern offices and stores, can be easily cut, or smashed after taping the surface to contain the glass or eliminate noise, and then the burglar need only reach in and open the lock from the inside.

Exposed hinges can be removed with pliers and a screw driver. You name the type of locking device and you can rest assured that there are both primitive and sophisticated methods known to burglars.
